II. Acceptance of November 26, 2012 Minutes

a. The November 26, 2012 OGRIP Forum Meeting Minutes were accepted. Motion by Jason Gillow and seconded by Darlene Magold-Scott. Motion passed by all present.

III. Business

a. OGRIP-OSIP-GIS-LBRS

- i. OSIP - Statewide Imagery 1 ft. data sets have been delivered to 25 counties. 31 counties were flown and the sets are being sent to the counties on a portable harddrive. All county profiles need to be updated before it can be sent. It would be very beneficial if the 11 essential questions were filled out yearly.
- ii. There is an opportunity for the Counties to buy-up additional imaging at state contract bid prices. At this point, 9 counties have signed up for buy-up.
- iii. 2012 downloads are available for tile and mosaics for countywide should be available this week. March 15th is the scheduled day to start image gathering for 2013 data sets.
- iv. A question was asked if there was any consideration or thought being given to doing a new Lidar Statewide elevation layer? It is a thought but not statewide – just for areas where there is great growth and would be open to partnering with another state agency to do this.
- v. LBRS – At this point 75 counties have been delivered. 2 are under development and 3-4 more will hopefully come on board this year with the Federal Highway Safety Funding and the use of LBRS at State level with Next Generation 911. The NG911 Steering Committee is looking at networks to support 911 and LBRS as the baseline. DOT can provide monies to support county activities and to help with LBRS costs.
- vi. The biggest issue with LBRS is maintaining and sustaining data sets. New activity needs to be updated almost daily to keep up with having the correct data to use for NG911. Next Generation 911 allows for other counties to pick-up another county's calls if one goes down.

ETech Ohio has been working with several school districts in the Central Ohio area and would like to get as many as possible on board with this program. The Ohio GIS Conference in 2012 has a student map gallery submission and student presentations. They would like this to be included again for the 2013 Conference.
