Presentation – Hoosier Hospitality – How GIS Works in Indiana

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Indiana Office of Technology, Geographic Information Office and Indiana Geographic Information Council regarding “Hoosier Hospitality” to partner with multiple organizations to create a seamless platform for Indiana’s geospatial community.

This partnership represents more than 100 organizations (local, county, state and federal agencies, universities, private businesses, etc.) over the last decade to help fund, develop, maintain, and share more than 260 spatial datasets, amounting to more than 30 terabytes of information. These data sets are made freely available to everyone through the IndianaMap portal, viewer and web services.

The presentation will discuss how the GIO and IGIC work together to advance GIS for all of Indiana. Some statewide examples that will be discussed include the Indiana Map, our County Data Sharing Initiative, Broadband Mapping, Orthophotography and LiDAR, and Local-Resolution National Hydrography Data Mapping Project.
