III. Business

a. Jeff Smith provided updates on the following OGRIP initiatives:

- i. OSIP II- Map various products standard products concluded operations on May 9th. The first tier counties not collected this spring have been pushed until Spring, 2012. Collection of enhanced products for Sandusky and Ottawa has been pushed until the Fall, Oblique imagery for the northern half of Ashtabula was collected, the southern will be flown in the fall as well. LIDAR is collected from Ottawa, Shelby and Greene which includes 3 postings per square meter. Highly accurate LIDAR becoming available for Franklin. Of the five counties obtaining oblique imagery, Ottawa is using Woolpert's SmartView product and other four are all using Pictometry. Lake County is a Pictometry renewal and the other three are new Pictometry customers.
- ii. LBRS- 75 Counties are participating with signed MOAs, 65 Counties have provided data.

 - V. **Presentation-** Jeffrey E. Duke, P.E., GISP Engineering Technical Services Manager, Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District, GIS Operations at the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District
The Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (District) is responsible for wastewater collection, conveyance and treatment in Northeast Ohio - which encompasses the City of Cleveland and all or part of 62 communities in 4 counties. The District heavily relies on GIS technology to help manage spatial and visual information related to its infrastructure, planning/analytical and operational/maintenance activities. Additionally, the District embarked on the implementation of regional Stormwater Management Program (SMP) - to provide comprehensive stream system and watershed management activities across the District's Service Area. To help ensure successful SMP implementation, a considerable amount of data and spatial analysis requirements (using GIS) need to be met to support SMP business process needs and SMP billing database/system implementation. Additionally, integration of the developing SMP GIS responsibilities, without diminishing existing level of service and limited staff resources, presented a series of administrative and economic challenges. This presentation will provide an overview (and some details) regarding some of the various uses of GIS in District operations and information on various GIS-related challenges and anticipated future plans.
